NEWBERRY COUNTY COUNCIL WORK SESSION MINUTES August 7, 2024

Newberry County Council met on Wednesday, August 7, 2024, at 5:01 p.m. in Council Chambers at the Courthouse Annex, 1309 College Street, Newberry, SC, for a Work Session.

Notice of the meeting was duly advertised, as required by law.

Mr. Johnson called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m.

- 1. Discussion of the South Carolina Community Development Block Grant program and the possible submission of a funding request in September 2024.
 - Mr. Shacker said the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) has been beneficial to Newberry County in particular, the City of Newberry and Town of Whitmire have utilized the grant to benefit the community. A variety of projects can be completed

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- utilizing the grant, both Whitmire and Newberry have used the grant with rehabbing their water and sewer and improvements in their downtown areas. Newberry County Government is also eligible to utilize the grant.
- Mr. Shacker said they have the ability to have two grants at one time, adding there is a threshold requirement, and they cannot exceed the threshold. However, he said the county is limited in where they can use those funds as this is HUD money that is distributed to the states, and the S.C. Department of Commerce is distributing the funds as a competitive grants program. The funds can only be used to benefit low- and moderate-income communities and or direct beneficiaries that are low and moderate income. To qualify, your household income levels can be no greater than 80% of the county median household income. Unless you qualify at the community level, which has to be 51% or greater low- and moderate-income.
- Mr. Shacker asked how receptive council would be to submitting a request for an application.
- Mr. Shealy asked if it were something the county would not have to take, if they are awarded, to which Mr. Shacker said no, you would not have to accept. Mr. Shealy also asked if there is a timeline that must be followed for a project to be completed, if the county got the grant; Mr. Shacker said they'd have 24 months, but they can request an extension.
- Mr. Shacker said the concept staff would propose to council, and staff has discussed this with the Town of Whitmire, would be to create a connection with the sidewalks, additional parking, lighting, some landscaping, running from Market Street down to Glenn, connection along Gilliam and tie in with the Gary Street project the county is currently doing. The town has interest in pursuing funding to renovate the local community center.
- Mr. Johnson said his first concern before they started any discussions with the CDBG was if they go in Whitmire and do something and not in other municipalities, the grant statistics really only allow in Whitmire. He and Mr. Shacker had a

conversation with the Whitmire mayor, and the town would have to be part of that match, as well. Mr. Johnson said the CTC did the match for the sidewalk project for the county, and maybe they would fund the match again.

- Mr. Fulmer asked if these are state roads, to which Mr. Johnson answered in the affirmative.
- Mr. Johnson reiterated if the county looks into this, and they are awarded the grant but everyone else says no, the county can decline.
- Mr. Sease asked what the percentage match is; Mr. Shacker said it is a 90/10 match with a maximum of \$750,000.
- Mr. Shacker said staff thought this was a great opportunity to connect all these key facilities downtown and connect to the current projects.
- Mr. Shealy said he thinks it is a great idea.
- Mr. Johnson said it seems unanimous to go ahead and do the investigation and ask for the application and move forward from there. Mr. Shacker said they will go ahead and get an estimate of the cost of the project and request the application. The application, if awarded, would be due in late September and the county would need to pass a resolution committing to the local match.
- 2. Discussion of the Southeast Crescent Regional Commission and the possible submission of a request for funding through the SCRC's Competitive Grants program.
 - Mr. Shacker said, regarding the CPST amphitheater project, a benefit to the project – to which the City of Newberry agrees – would be to establish some physical connections with Caldwell and McKibben streets. The thought was to shave some of the expenses off the CPST project and cover them with the grant. However, they discovered CDBG is not available for the City of Newberry, due to income levels.

- There is a new entity, Southeast Crescent Regional Commission, with a grant program that they awarded projects a few weeks ago. Mr. Shacker said a few of those projects were streetscapes, like they are discussing around the amphitheater. He said the grant would be less than CDBG and they may not be able to do both McKibben and Caldwell, but if council is comfortable staff can make plans to address Caldwell Street. He said the concept they discussed with the City of Newberry would be paving the street, installing a very wide sidewalk, decorative lights, street trees, and some electrical work.
- Mr. Shealy asked if this grant was an 80/20, Mr. Shacker said he thinks this one is also 90/10.
- Mr. Hipp said that would more than offset the savings from CPST,
 Mr. Shealy asked if the City of Newberry would help with the match, to which Mr. Shacker said the city seemed receptive.
- Mr. Hipp said the amphitheater is a joint project between the city and county, and although Caldwell Street is a state-owned street, that will be a major access to the amphitheater and anything they can do there to help.
- Mr. Johnson complimented Mr. Shacker on the information he
 was able to provide the council on these grants and the vision to
 see the need and where to apply it. Mr. Shealy added anytime
 you can find free money, they'll take it.
- Mr. Shacker said they would come back to council before they move forward with the grant.

Mr. Johnson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Mr. Johnson led the invocation and Pledge of Allegiance for Mr. Reeder who was out sick.

 - Mr. Hipp made a motion to accept the minutes as presented; Mr. Fulmer provided the second and the motion carried 6-0.

 - Mr. Sease made a motion to accept the agenda as published; Mr. Scurry provided the second and the motion carried 6-0.

3. Public Appearance:

- a. Lorie Graham, Newberry Area Business Consultant, S.C. Small Business Development Centers
 - Ms. Graham said their mission is to advance South Carolina economic development by helping small businesses to succeed. One of the ways they do that is by offering tools that small business owners may not otherwise be available to get, such as Vertical IQ. They also help with business plans and helping businesses with lenders and getting with banks and attorney referrals. She said the services they offer help businesses with areas such as marketing, web design, HR operations, etc. They also have specialists that can assist small business owners.
 - Mr. Sease asked if there is a limit to the number of employees; Ms. Graham said no, there is no minimum number, and they help businesses that have up to 500 employees.
 - Mr. Hipp asked if Ms. Graham knows Mr. Rick Farmer, Newberry County Economic Development director. Ms. Graham said she does, and he recommended she come before Newberry County Council. Mr. Hipp said he thinks that is good as she looks at helping small businesses and Mr. Farmer works to take care of large industries,

but sometimes small businesses support large businesses. Mr. Hipp said it would be good for them to continue to work together.

 - Mr. Hipp made a motion to accept third reading; Mr. Sease provided the second and the motion carried 6-0.

 - Mr. Shacker said the county's CPST projects are well underway, and they've been having meetings with project architects.
 - Mr. Shacker said they have a number of grant funded projects, including three in Lynch's Woods, and the CDBG project in Whitmire for sidewalks.

10. Comments/Requests from Council.

- Mr. Sease thanked everyone for coming out and appreciates everyone for attending the meetings.
- Mr. Hipp recognized Mr. Stuart Smith, who is running unopposed to fill his seat once he retires at the end of the year and he is sure he will leave it in ample hands. Mr. Hipp then asked Mr. Shacker for an update on the emergency services vehicles that were out of service because they were getting worked on.
 - Mr. Shacker said there was a good bit of step-up work by the company the county contracts with for vehicle maintenance and he knows they have made headway, and he knows the ambulances are back on the road.
 - Mr. Hipp would also like to know an update on getting backup services for repairs. Mr. Shacker said they have met with those they contract with to establish a plan.

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- Mr. Fulmer thanked everyone for coming out and taking part in county government. Mr. Fulmer said they had a firetruck they were in the process of getting purchased and asked Mr. Shacker where they were with that.
 - Mr. Shacker said they have issued the purchase order, and confirmed the deal has been sealed. He added they have a tanker that needs to be replaced and they have the amount of the insurance claim in, and they will keep council posted but the cost of the truck will exceed the insurance claim.
 - Mr. Sease said he went to a meeting last night and they have a couple of trucks coming down the line that they will be able to order instead of waiting a few years.
- Mr. Shealy thanked everyone for coming out and told Mr. Shacker excellent job going out and finding opportunities and his vision he has for the county is excellent and they appreciate all he is doing and will do.
- Mr. Johnson said happy birthday to Mr. Wigger, who they let have the evening off. He told Mr. Stuart Smith it was a blessing to have him with them tonight and he has some huge shoes to fill, and he looks forward to working with him. Mr. Johnson commended Mr. Shacker for the vision and balancing of those projects and not losing focus on one project for another and that is a blessing for Newberry County.

WHEREAS, Newberry County Council recognizes the importance of a safety action plan to help reduce the number of deaths and serious injuries on our highways, streets and roads; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Transportation has established an annual grant program funding local projects that improve roadway safety; and

WHEREAS, U.S. DOT has issued a call for applications for the 2024 Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Planning and Implementation Grants; and

WHEREAS, the staff recommends applying for a SS4A Planning Grant, which will fund the development of an Action Plan to improve roadway safety; and

WHEREAS, staff seeks endorsement from Newberry County Council to apply for a SS4A Planning Grant for the maximum amount of \$240,000 to develop an Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, the proposed grant will require a 20% local match of \$60,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Council of the County of Newberry, South Carolina hereby endorses Newberry County's SS4A Planning Grant Application to develop an Action Plan to improve roadway safety.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY OF NEWBERRY, BY NEWBERRY COUNTY COUNCIL, TO SELL REAL PROPERTY IDENTIFIED AS TAX MAP NUMBER 290-11 AND DESCRIBED IN INVITATION FOR BID NUMBER 2024-4 UPON SUCH TERMS AND CONDITIONS AS DESCRIBED IN THE INVITATION FOR BID AND THROUGH AN AGREEMENT OF PURCHASE

WHEREAS, the County of Newberry (the "County") is a political subdivision of the State of South Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Newberry Council (the "Council") is the duly elected governing body of the County of Newberry; and

WHEREAS, the Council is vested with the authority to sell and dispose of real property owned by the County pursuant to Section 4-9-30 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, 1976, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the County is the owner of that certain parcel of real property, 46 +/- acres in size, located near the City of Newberry on South Carolina Highway 121 By-Pass and identified as Tax Map Number 290-11 (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Council determined, as a fact and after appropriate investigation, that the Property is no longer needed for county purposes and would be of better and higher use and benefit to the County if owned by an individual or entity other than the County, and that as such the Property constitutes surplus property; and

WHEREAS, the County solicited sealed bids for the disposition of the Property and issued the Invitation for Bid via advertisement on May 29, 2024; and

WHEREAS, on July 2, 2024, the bids were received, accepted and opened, and the highest bid was presented to the Council at its July 17, 2024 meeting for consideration and award, which the Council by motion and vote approved; and

WHEREAS, Section 4-9-130 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, 1976, as amended requires the use of an ordinance to sell or dispose of real property owned by the County and that the Council conduct a public hearing prior to passage of such an ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Council now desires to undertake the legislative process required by South Carolina law to approve the sale of the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the County Council of the County of Newberry, in Council duly assembled this 4th day of September 2024 that:

The Council does hereby authorize the sale of the Property, described in Invitation for Bid Number 2024-4, which is attached as Exhibit "A", to the highest bidder as awarded by Council at its meeting on July 17, 2024, and upon such terms and conditions described in the advertised Invitation for Bid and through an Agreement of Purchase, which is attached as Exhibit "B". Both Exhibits are incorporated herein by reference. This Ordinance shall be effective upon adoption by the Council on the date of final reading approval.
